

1. RFU COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

No sooner- it seems- than the season has started we are at the halfway point of 23-24, moving fast now away from those periods during Covid when no Rugby was played.

Like society in general, the game has had a lot of changes to deal with. Clubs with backgrounds in banking, the emergency services, and to a lesser degree, Old Boys' clubs have struggled to survive and some haven't. Despite this, and with Kent reducing to 53 RFU voting clubs and around 10 affiliate members we are still one of the top six or seven Counties that has the highest number of clubs in England.

We enter 2024 as the Senior County Champions and despite Covid, eventually, last July, got our development squad at Senior level on tour in South Africa.

Taff Gwilliam our Representative DOR, organised coaching master classes for the Women's and Girls' Game and for the Men, some top professional coaches imparting their knowledge.

Guy Slater, one of our Senior County doctors, also organised the first - and very successful - Conference for our physios and medics. He is already well advanced in organising next year's event.

In the meantime, our clubs at RFU league level and in the Merit tables have worked hard to recruit and retain new players in an environment where it requires more squad players to get sides out because players want to turn out less regularly. The last couple of weeks at the Merit table level both in Met and Rural, are proving particularly difficult. Let's hope that after Christmas the improvement levels in game completion experienced in October and November return to the normal pattern.

And so to 2024, it is hoped for additional volunteers at club and County level, to the retention of the County Championship and to ensuring we lose no more Kent Clubs. We hope, too, that the 53 clubs still in action are able to retain or grow the number of sides currently being fielded.

We will be working alongside our RFU colleagues to ensure that we properly communicate the introduction of Adult player registration to go with the Age Grade system.

We will also be helping with a look at how the first two years of the Future Competition Structure changes have gone, including the introduction of lower sides to the RFU leagues.



I could highlight a range of further challenges and opportunities but don't want to take up too much of your Festive time.

I conclude by thanking all of our volunteers within the County set up, our RFU colleagues and Tracy for all her work. Thank you, too, to all or clubs' volunteers, for all you do to keep our great game alive helping it to recover.


The assessment day will also be a chance to be assessed for the Saracens Player Development Group.
