

Match Report: Kent Triumph in Thrilling Encounter with Eastern Counties

In a pulsating encounter brimming with attacking flair and dramatic momentum shifts, **Kent secured a thrilling 45-40 victory** over a determined Eastern Counties side. The match, played at a relentless pace, saw the lead change hands multiple times before Kent held on for a memorable win.

Kent rallied brilliantly. A sharp scrum platform put **Nematswerari** in space to score and tie it at 28-28. Minutes later, Nematswerari pounced on a loose ball and dashed under the posts for his second, giving Kent a 35-28 lead.

Eastern Counties hit back immediately, capitalising on a restart error to score a swift unconverted try (35-33), but Kent surged again through **Ward**, who dotted down after quick phase play. Though the conversion was missed, **Nathan** added another try from close range, Ward converting to make it 45-33.

Eastern Counties wouldn't go away, slicing through for a late try to cut the margin to five points. However, Kent's defence held firm in the dying minutes, securing a dramatic and deserved win.
